Welcome to Worship!

“Let’s go to the house of the Lord!” (Psalm 122:1) We rejoice that you’re here today. Each time we gather, we hear of God’s grace and respond with prayers and songs of praise.

Visitors:

Take a moment to sign a **Friendship Register** located at the end of each pew. Your info helps us get to know you and allows us to stay in touch with you. Restrooms are located at the east end of the entryway, past the Coffee Nook.

Parents with Young Children:

Helping little ones learn to praise God is a messy project! Feel free to choose a place where kids can engage with the sights and sounds of worship. Make use of our ‘busy bags’ from the rack in the entryway. A closed-circuit TV is also located in the parent room to watch and listen to the service. An usher can assist you in locating this room, also called the “Gathering Place”.

Limited Mobility?

For your convenience, there are two areas set aside to accommodate those with wheelchairs, walkers, or other special space needs. Ushers are available to assist you.

Hard of Hearing?

A hearing loop system in place. Adjust your hearing aids to “T” coil. For the best reception, sit on the pulpit side of church, excluding the back four rows. Special receiver packs with earbuds are also available if needed.

Worship Notes

About the Worship Series: What is God Like?

After the joy of Easter, the Christian Church celebrates three special festivals which can often be overlooked. Each of them gives us a great lesson of the majesty and work of each person of our Triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

- Forty days after his resurrection, **God the Son** goes to his heavenly throne on **Ascension Day**.
- Ten days later, the **Holy Spirit** arrives on the **Day of Pentecost** and breathes life into to the Christian Church.
- The first week after Pentecost, falling this year on Father's Day weekend, allows us to take a close look at the work of **God the Father** as we celebrate the mystery of the **Holy Trinity**.

While each service highlights the particular work of one person, the services are also connected to each other. We join in confessing our faith by explaining each of the articles of the creed and close each service with a hymn based on the apostolic blessing: *May the Peace of God...*

Theme of the Day: The Week After Pentecost: Holy Trinity

Today's worship marks a change in the seasons: We've passed the halfway point in the year of grace that began with Advent and Christmas and brought us through the celebration of Easter and Pentecost. This second half of the Church year explores how Christians respond to the great story of God's love that we have learned to this point. For generations, Christians have used the first week of the Pentecost season to focus on the powerful doctrine of the Trinity: we worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God.

About the Service:

As the third installment of our worship series, today's service connects with the others in the hymns and prayers. Notice that the closing hymn is repeated from the previous two weeks. Notice also the final portion of Martin Luther's explanation of the creed, today looking at the work of God the Father. Another confession of faith that we often use on Trinity Sunday is the Athanasian Creed. It is an impressive statement written to clearly correct two errors in Christian teaching. Though it's length might cause us to overlook its truths, you can find it on pages 132-133 in the red hymnals. As you read it, consider how the love of God the Father is powerfully and mysteriously shared with the other persons of the Triune God.

God reveals a Father's love as he sends his Son and Holy Spirit

Who is it that overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God.

This is the one who came by water and blood—Jesus Christ. He did not come by water only, but by water and blood. And it is the Spirit who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth. For there are three that testify: the Spirit, the water and the blood; and the three are in agreement. We accept human testimony, but God's testimony is greater because it is the testimony of God, which he has given about his Son. Whoever believes in the Son of God accepts this testimony. Whoever does not believe God has made him out to be a liar, because they have not believed the testimony God has given about his Son. And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.






