## Today's Lesson: Road to Emmaus

Last week we saw the empty tomb. "Jesus has risen!" an angel told the women who entered Jesus' empty tomb. Then Jesus himself appeared to the women to dispel all lingering doubts. Later in the day Jesus appeared to 2 discouraged disciples as they walked to Emmaus. Not recognizing him, the disciples told him that they had lost hope in Jesus as the Savior. Jesus used the Old Testament prophecies to show them that the Savior had to die and rise again to save all people from their sins. Then he revealed himself and disappeared from their sight. The happy disciples ran to share the news with the other disciples in Jerusalem.
